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# Nursery enjoyed our sports coach visit this week!





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
This week reception have been using sweets to look at doubling, sharing and odd and even numbers! What yummy maths!







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This week in Peake Class, we have really got stuck into our new topic on castles! 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Congratulations to Darwin class who had the highest attendance in Key Stage 1 this week!






Congratulations to Hopper and King Class who had the highest attendance in Key Stage 2 this week!


