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EXCITING NEWS!


I am extremely excited to announce some fantastic news for Lillington. I have been working hard over the last couple of years to recover the financial situation at Lillington, in order to do this, it has meant that I have had no senior members of staff to support me in the role of Head Teacher and to build capacity within Senior leadership. We are now finally in a place where we are able to appoint 2 Assistant Heads from September, these roles will be extremely valuable to not just me but also to the school and its continued journey of improvement. On Monday interviews were held with internal candidates. This process was extremely rigorous and was conducted by myself, Mr Bailie (Executive Head of the Trust), Mrs Coopey (Chair of Governors), Mr Fitzhugh (Deputy Head at Finham Primary) and Mrs O'Toole (Primary Support and Innovation Lead for FPMAT). I am pleased to announce that both Mr Holt and Mrs Radcliffe were successful in being appointed as the new Assistant Heads at Lillington. Mr Holt will be responsible for Key stage 2 and Mrs Radcliffe EYFS and Key Stage 1, however they will of course work as a team to support me in the day to day running of the school. Both teachers will still be classed based and so will have classes next year with some additional leadership release time in order to fulfil their new roles.

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To consolidate our number bonds to 10, Reception have been making 10 in lots of different ways this week.









Tickets are £1 each and there's a guaranteed £20 win each week that goes up the more tickets are sold. There's also a chance to win a £25,000 jackpot!!


At the end of the month there's also the chance to win one of five £100 B&Q vouchers And all the time you're helping to raise funds to support the PTFA.


