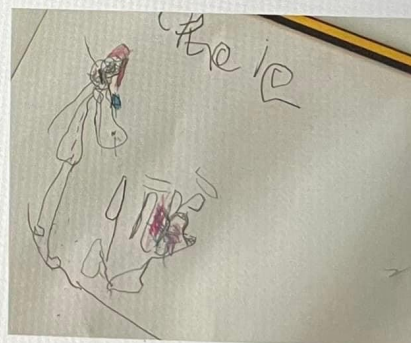
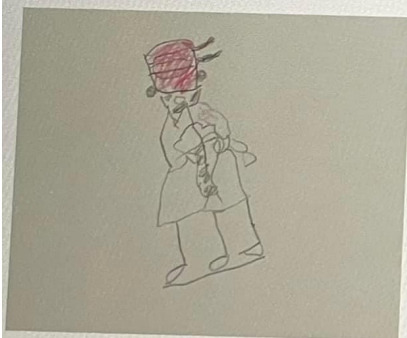
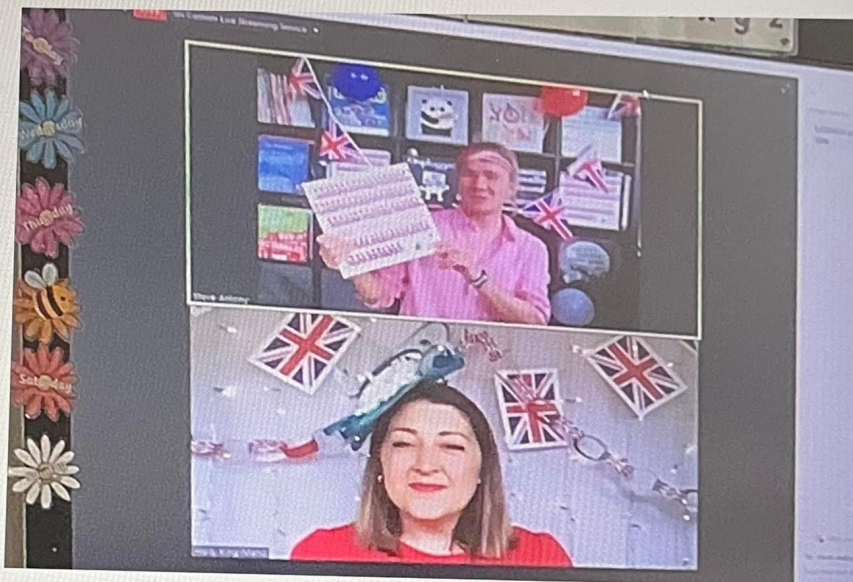

In winter the weather is snowy

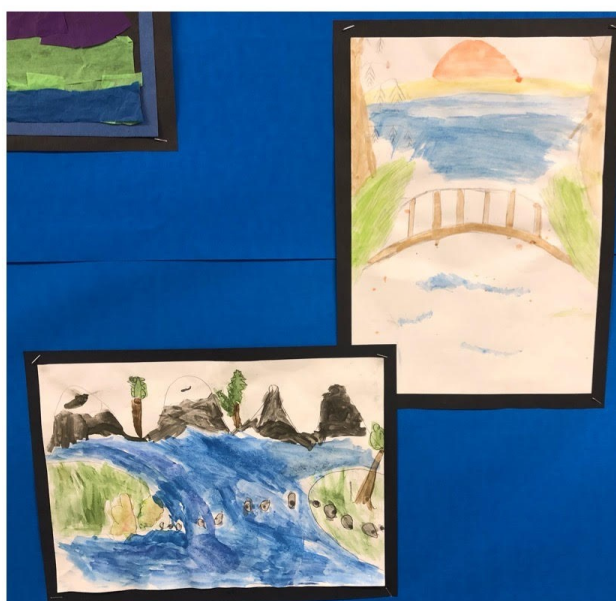
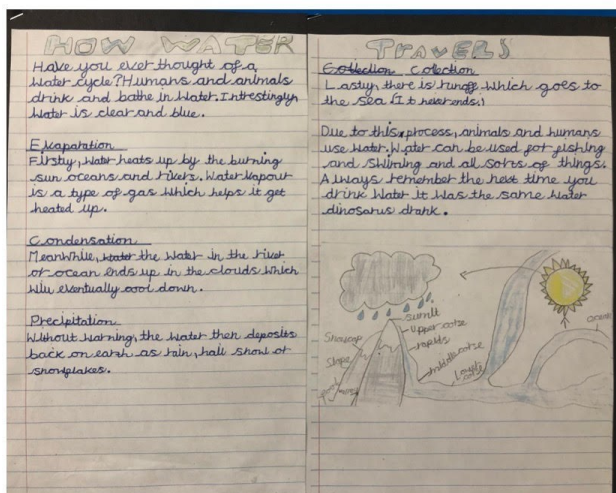

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Children in King Class have been writing newspaper reports about Martin Luther King's death. Initially, they had to do some research into his death and the people who were there. They have written two drafts of their reports to make sure they're as good as they can be. Here are some examples...

#### Dr. King Shot Dead!

At 6:05pm yesterday, Martin Luther King was shot dead by an unknown gunman.

Martin Luther King, who was a civil rights leader, was shot dead on the balcony of the Lorraine Motel, Memphis, Tennessee. At around 6pm, a single shot was fired by an unknown assassin. Although it is not 100% certain, police think it is because Martin was trying to get black people rights.

Martin, who was about to lead a protest about workers' rights, was hit in the neck with a single bullet. Jesse Jackson (another well known protester) was with King when he got shot. He said, "He had just bent over. I reckon if he had been standing up he would not have been hit in the head."

Police are scanning the area for a well-dressed white male who was

last seen in a blue car. He was seen by witnesses dropping a semi-automatic rifle as he left the crime scene.

There have been early sights of rioting as people respond to his death. Around 4,000 members of the National Guard have been sent to Memphis. President Johnson has delayed a trip to settle down the violence. He said, "I ask every citizen to reject the blind violence."

Since King died his family, friends and the people who support him are in mourning. There is a chance that riots will come back because people are so angry. It is believed that this horrible death might help for rights for black people.

#### Martin Luther King Jr. Shot Dead

Yesterday at 6:05pm, Luther King got shot dead by an unknown shooter.

Martin Luther King was shot by an unknown shooter, at the Lorraine Motel in Memphis, Tennessee just after 6 pm. Martin got killed by a single bullet that hit him in the neck and he died in hospital. Although it's only the start of the investigation, investigators believe that it had something to do with him trying to stop racism and his peaceful protests for equal rights.

King, who was determined to lead a protest against workers' rights, was on the balcony when he got shot in the neck once. Jesse Jackson, who was standing near Martin when he was killed said, "He had just bent down, if he didn't stand up he possibly wouldn't have been killed." The bullet would have hit him in the stomach many of the investigators thought and it's easier to survive being shot in the stomach than the head.

Police Memphis are looking for a well-dressed white man who was seen by witnesses and got away in a blue car. The unknown suspect dropped his semi-automatic rifle as he successfully got away.

Friends, family, supporters and many others are devastated about Martin's death. 4,000 members of the national guard have been ordered to Memphis by the government to prevent loud, violent riots. President Johnson had postponed a flight to Hawaii to calm the violence down. Johnson asked the country, "I ask every person who lives in this area to reject the disgraceful violence that has taken King's life."

Now that King has passed his family, friends and other civil rights leaders are in mourning. There is expected to be loud riots that will be in place because civil rights activists are furious. It is hoped his death might lead to better rights towards black people.

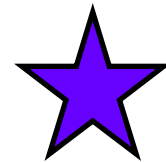

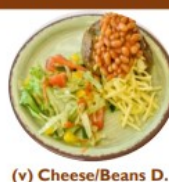
