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Reception have been working on their observational drawing skills and using watercolours to paint pictures of pumpkins.

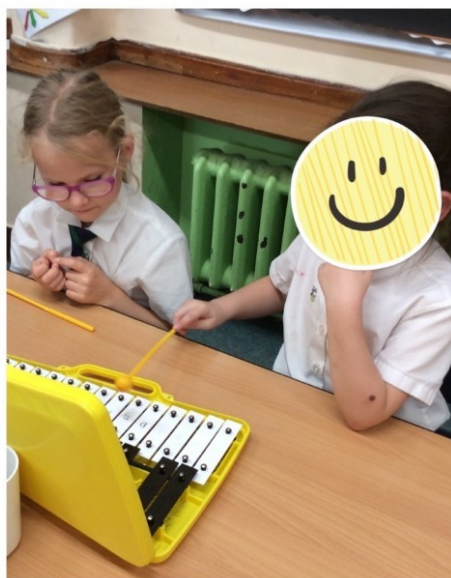


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This week, Year 3 continued their music lessons by recognising the pulse of a song using glockenspiels. They had a fantastic time getting hands on with a musical instrument!
