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Darwin have begun exploring a new story this week- Little Red Hiding Hood! We have used drama to help us get immersed into the new text.






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In Peake Class this week, children have been learning all about instruction writing.

As a starting activity, we followed instructions to make chocolate milkshake!











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
Year 4 have enjoyed writing their own Defeating the Monster stories.




