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Huge thank you to the LSPTFA for funding a light panel and resources for Bevan Class. We are looking forward to using them for all sorts of different learning opportunities.



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
Year 4 have had fun exploring weaving in our DT project Warp and Weft.













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
Pankhurst have been exploring cubed numbers this week. They have began to develop their teamwork skills and improved their knowledge of square and cube numbers.





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
