After a lot of practice, the finished products look great!

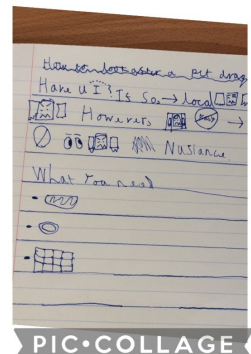
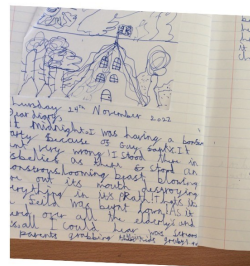
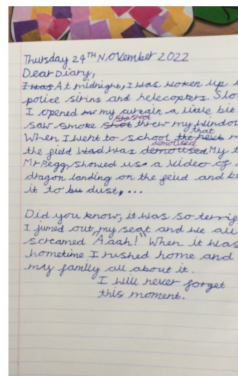
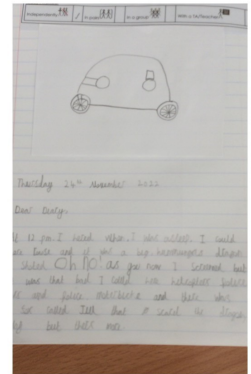
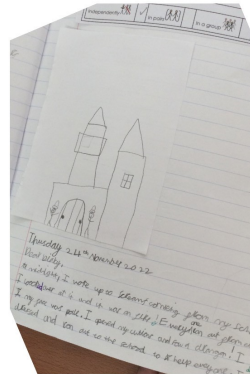
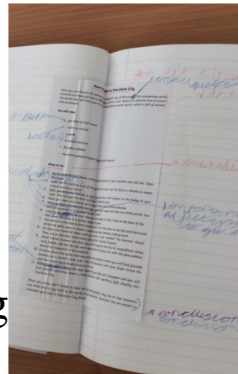


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After the excitement of having a dragon land on the school field this week, Year 4 have begun to look at instructions on how to look after a pet dragon.

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Pankhurst have had a busy week. Lots of fun at the cinema, exploring multiplying in maths and drama in English.



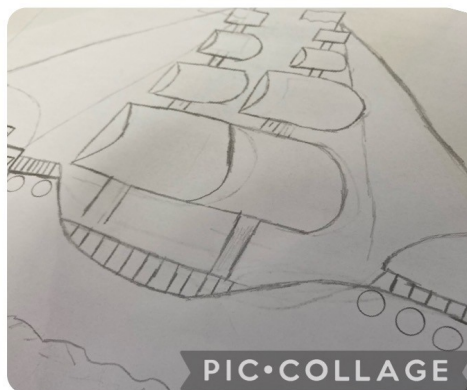
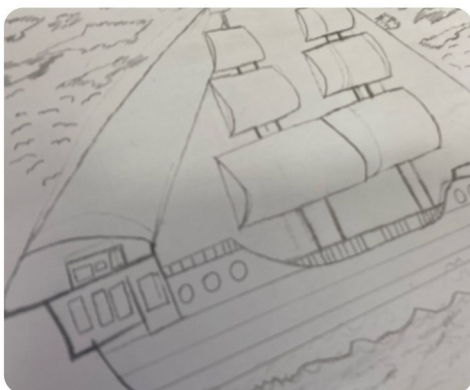
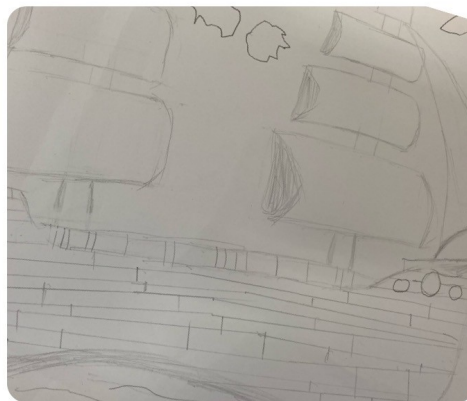
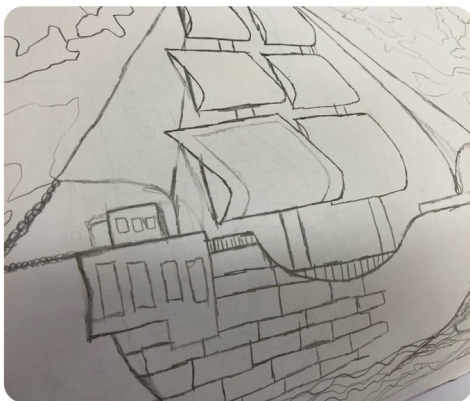
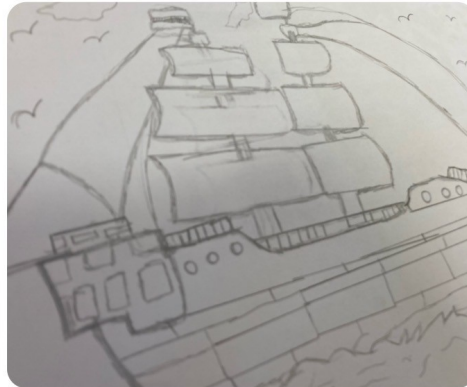

PLEASE NOTE some schools serve the cold option in a deli bag with vegetable sticks or salad, a dessert and a drink.

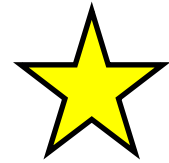

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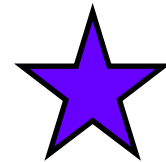
