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Yesterday we said goodbye to the ducklings in nursery, we have really enjoyed looking after them and teaching them how to swim!







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Pankhurst are loving their PE sessions with Mr Findlay. They have learnt and developed new skills and have progressed on to small games now.



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






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CELEBRATION!
