The children have all taken part in British Science Week activities throughout the week (it was actually last week but we were too busy). Each class has tried to beat the world record – 4m 26cm – for stretching a Cadbury's Curly Wurly. Alongside the fun, they've planned scientific enquiries, made predictions, recorded their findings and written conclusions. Thanks to Miss Bailey for organising all the activities. The winners of the science competition were Simas (Yr 1) and Dominic (Maple). Well done to everyone who put in an entry.



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Reception have had another busy week. We've embraced the sunshine, the wind and the rain this week but had great fun.








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




HAD FUN!
