Head Teacher to Home - 19 May What has happened in Peake this week?


Year 2 have enjoyed learning about internet safety this week in IT. The children discussed what they would do if they came across an inappropriate website.

Franklin have been working on circuits this half term. We've finished off by making a steady hand game.











Head Teacher to Home - 19 May What has happened in Drew Class this

This week, Drew class have been preparing to make miniature greenhouses. They have been learning lots about the materials needed, and practised



















Head Teacher to Home - 19 May What has happened in Hopper this week?


Local support available.
